

Logline

As minority communities face the daily stranglehold of racial profiling, and police officers face relentless scrutiny by an anxious public, tensions mount as lines are being drawn in the sand. This conflict can only be broken by finding common ground with each other. L.O.V.E. Is The Answer.!

Synopsis

Instances of racial profiling plague minority communities on a daily basis. Director, A.J. Ali is no stranger to this phenomenon. When he and his wife were targeted for harassment by police numerous times in Howard County, Maryland, he was forced to take a stand. Though his attempts at achieving justice through channels offered by the system went unrewarded, he refused to let go of the dream that a solution to the problem could be found. He went on a quest for truth and reconciliation, which led him to find living examples of love in action. More than four years in the making, **WALKING WHILE BLACK: L.O.V.E. Is The Answer** presents proven action steps to bridge the painful gap between peace officers and the communities they serve. **L.O.V.E.** is an acronym best described in this pledge: I pledge to **LEARN** about the people in my community, to unconditionally **OPEN** my heart to their needs as if they were all immediate family members, to **VOLUNTEER** to be part of the solution in their life during both good and challenging times, and to **EMPOWER** everyone I meet to do the same as if our lives depended on each other. Featuring interviews with peace officers, faith leaders, educators, activists and others, the film offers an inspiring blueprint to end racial profiling, promote racial equity, and heal our communities.



Director's Statement

The making of **WALKING WHILE BLACK: L.O.V.E. Is The Answer** was the most deeply personal journey I've ever taken as a Producer, and a huge leap for me as a first-time director. Not having had formal training as a director, I went with my gut. At the outset, I wanted to make an angry film about the problems, and I wanted to just get a lot of people fired and get a lot of troubled departments shut down. That was at the beginning. After 2 1/2 years of trying to get that angry film made, I had a life-changing moment. At the end of a 50-state, 101-day "walkabout," I found myself standing in the waters of Kailua Beach on the island of Oahu in Hawaii. It was my 51st birthday. I felt the aloha spirit and heard a voice in my heart telling me to let go of the anger, fear, and anxiety, and put love into action.

Then I remembered the last words of my older brother Abbey on his deathbed in 1998, saying “love is the answer.” I felt a baptism wash over me with the waters and trade winds and at that moment, I was changed forever. That’s when the entire focus of the film, and my life, changed to **L.O.V.E. Is The Answer**. From that moment, the film, which would eventually be cut from 65 hours of video and more than 50 interviews, fell into place. It took a year of planning and prepping with the new focus, and another year of shooting and editing, to get the film done. The film has become like a cult classic, with most people watching it more than once and some people watching it 10 or 15 times, each time gaining some new aspect, angle, or appreciation of the work.


I get calls and emails nearly every day about how the film is changing lives. I thought **WALKING WHILE BLACK: L.O.V.E. Is The Answer** would make a difference. I had no idea that we would revolutionize the police-community relationship in the way that we have — and we’re just getting started. The film has birthed a companion book, webinars, a podcast, and other teaching tools that are inspiring people nationwide to make L.O.V.E.- Based Policing the new standard. I couldn’t be happier with the results. If you’re making a film that you want to be meaningful, go find yourself, and then listen to your gut.

Producer's Statement

We had no money for most of the time we worked on the film. From mid-June 2012 until the film was released in February 2017, we were broke. There's no way we should have been able to complete the film, and at such a high quality, but God. There's really no other way to explain it. **WALKING WHILE BLACK: L.O.V.E. Is The Answer** was born out of desperation. I experienced a horrible racial profiling incident and sought an apology from the police department. When I didn't get one, I decided to tell a story.

This wasn't a case of "hey, let's make a film." This was, "if we don't make this film, and make it count, people will die." So, the production always felt like we were on a greater mission. If money was no object, as in "no money," so be it. We had to get the job done. After pushing through literally hundreds of "no's," we started to get some yes's. One thing, and one person after another, began to line up. We had at least two dozen delays and stops because of the lack of capital, but the more we came back to it and pressed on, the more things began to come together. There was never a moment where we felt "we've got this."

All the way up to the last day before the premiere, we struggled. In fact, the film was exporting up until the very last minute, threatening a delay in the start of the film. When those curtains opened and the film played for an audience for the very first time, it was magic. Not a dry eye in the place. The takeaway for me is "we'll win if we don't quit." That's the takeaway that I want every viewer to feel when they watch the film. They'll have no idea about how hard it was to get the film made, but I hope they feel the film move them into a space of truth and reconciliation just like it did me and our entire cast and crew.

Melvin Russell joined The Baltimore Police Department in 1979 as a police cadet and in 1981 graduated as the first and still only African American Male class valedictorian from The Baltimore Police Academy. Mel worked uniform patrol for a few years then got his first opportunity to work in an undercover drug capacity 1986. For the next 20 years Mel was submerged into the dark world of undercover narcotic work that led to the arrests of drug kingpins from Baltimore City to Jamaica, Italy, China and South America. In 2006 Melvin tried to retire, but God had another plan for him. Reluctantly Mel remained and over the next 19 months was promoted from sergeant to lieutenant, deputy major and then major over the most violent district of the city. With 130 officers under his command Mel took community, faith-based, schools and all area stakeholders to the next level through initiatives based on “An Engaged Presence Brings Reduction” and “Relational Equity.” Over the next 4 ½ years his district experience historical crime reductions that hadn’t been seen in over 40 years. After posting such success Mel was promoted to LT Colonel (then eventually Colonel/Chief) creating The Community Partnership Division (CPD) in January 2013.
